European guidelines for intership and apprenticeship

Common objectives:

- high quality standards and level of learning
- reduce youth unemployment
- reduce early school leaving



- Promoting work-based learning, including through quality training and apprenticeship periods and other double learning models
- Making apprenticeships more attractive for companies and young people
- Encouraging partnerships between public institutions and private companies to ensure adequate curricula and learning outcomes
- Supporting the mobility of learners and trainees through the Erasmus + programs















Italian answer: the legal basis

Decree 15th June 2015, n. 81, or «JOBS ACT»

(New rules for Apprenticeships)



Law 13th July 2015, n. 107 (Buona Scuola)

Enhancing educational offer through «School Work Exchange Program»)

Law 30th December 2018, n. 145 (the redenomination of the «School Work Exchange Program» in "pathways for transversal skills and orientation" (hereinafter referred to as PCTO) starting from the 2018/2019 school year:

- at least 210 hours in Professional Institutes (from 400)
- at least 150 hours in Technical Institutes (from 400)
- > at least 90 hours in high schools (from 200)

What is a work based learning experience?

Work Based Learning is an educational approach or instructional methodology that uses the workplace or real **work** to provide students with the knowledge and skills that will help them connect school **experiences** to real-life **work** activities and future career opportunities.

Work-based learning experiences provide the opportunity to strengthen **six key soft skill areas** - communication, enthusiasm and attitude, teamwork, networking, problem solving and critical thinking, and professionalism. These types of skills provide a competitive advantage for achieving career goals.















WBL in the schools

- The schools need to introduce entrepreneurial education courses for their students.
- Paths such as school-work exchange (PCTO) risk being totally ineffective if teachers do not carry out adequate preparation for students who are preparing to do work experience in companies.
- This and other critical issues highlights how important it is on the one hand to provide school teachers with effective tools and know-how to prepare students and on the other to encourage companies to invest in school and in entrepreneurial mentorship. *In Italy, for example, companies (especially small and family-run ones) do not know how to approach young people or do not seem interested in the topic.*

















PCTO & Apprenticeship: common features

- Joint planning and programming between school and external organization
- Cooperation between two tutors /trainers
- Shared criteria for assessment and evaluation

Create a sustainable system for the training of <u>dual tutors</u>

- Joint training of teachers and external training tutors, on the subject of transition from school to work (PCTO and apprenticeship)
- The Project is intended for the training of <u>school tutors</u> (of PCTO or apprenticeship), of <u>VET tutors</u> (apprenticeship) and <u>company tutors</u>, who are interacting in the same group for the entire duration of the training course.
